Estimated Seriously Emotionally Disturbed Youth Ages 9-17	This is the estimated number of youth ages 9-17 years old with a serious emotional disturbance with substantial to extreme functional impairment. The estimate is based on a report called Mental Health, United States, 1996 from the Department of Health and Human Services which found that conservatively, 9% of the population ages 9-17 years old is affected. Using the 9% estimate results in rates for all counties being equal. The change in numbers over time is directly reflective of the change in population of that age group rather than a change in the mental health status of the population. Data are from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.
Estimated Seriously Mentally III Adults	Serious mental illness among people ages 18 and older is defined as having, at any time during the past year, a diagnosable mental, behavior, or emotional disorder that causes serious functional impairment that substantially interferes with or limits one or more major life activities. Serious mental illnesses include major depression, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and other mental disorders that cause serious impairment. These counts are estimates based on the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) statement that 4.0% of the population 18 and over in 2012 and 2013, 3.6% of the population 18 and over in 2014-2016, and 3.9% of the population and in each county. The change in numbers over time is directly reflective of the change population of that age group rather than a change in the mental health status of the population. Estimates are based on the Queartment of Health and Human Services Mental Health. United States. 1996
