Current Features

HIV/AIDS Awareness

In 2019, 4,584 persons were [newly diagnosed with HIV](#), a 4% decrease from 2018. In 2019, 38% were black, 36% Hispanic/Latino, and 24% white; 36% were between the ages of 13–29, 43% were age 30–49 and 21% were over the age of 50. The majority (59%) were men who had sexual contact with men, 34% had heterosexual contact, and 5% were persons who inject drugs. Statewide, 31 counties saw an increase in new diagnoses of HIV from 2018 to 2019, however, an annual decrease was observed in three of the seven largest reporting counties: Broward (-7%), Duval (-4%) and Palm Beach (-1%).

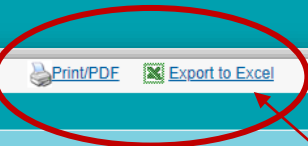

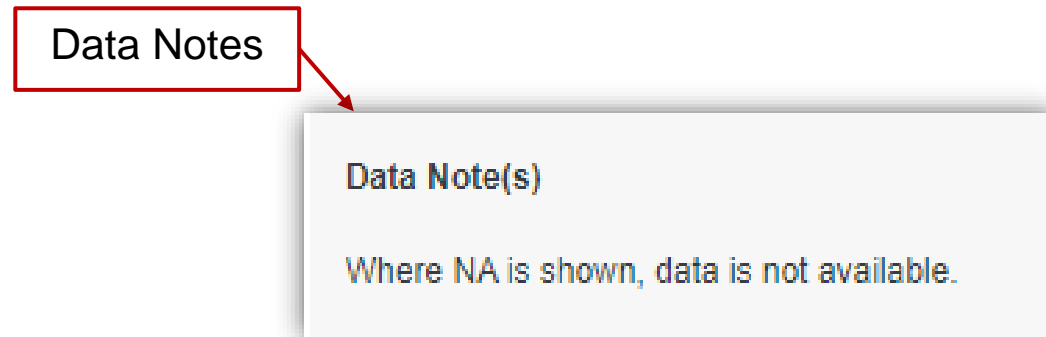

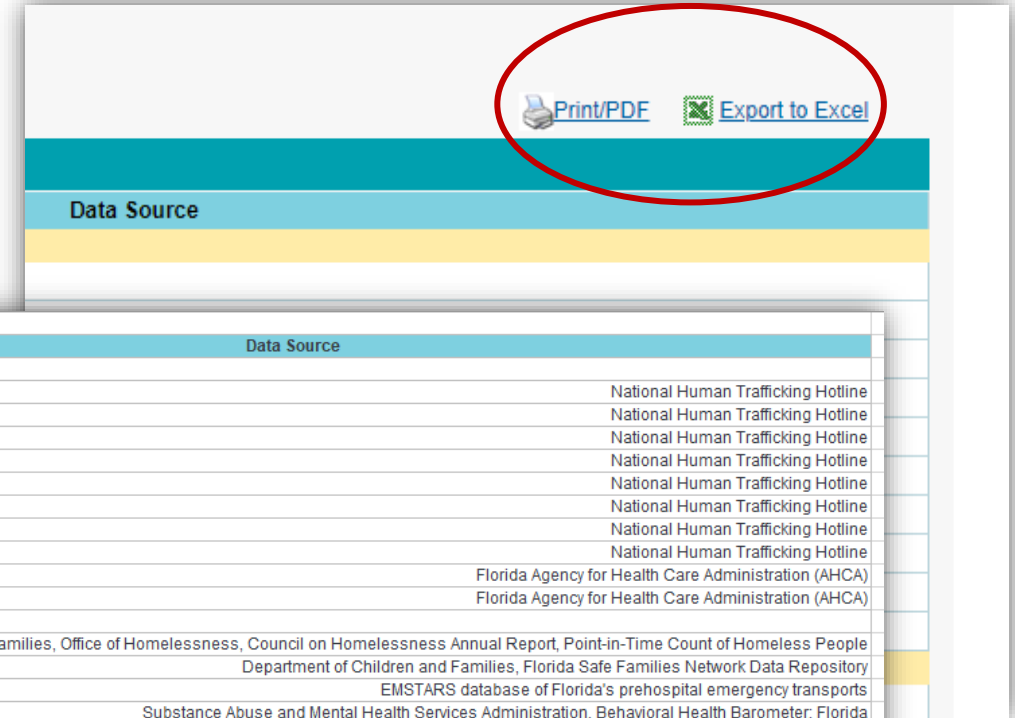

Case Definitions Human Trafficking Profile

Measure	Case Definition
Adults Experiencing 4 or More Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)	Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) include experiencing abuse and/or neglect (emotional abuse/neglect, physical abuse/neglect, sexual abuse) or household challenges (intimate partner violence, substance abuse in the household, mental illness in the household, parental separation or divorce, incarcerated household member) in the first 18 years of life. Data are from the Florida Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) Report.
Arrests for Non-Forcible Sex Offenses	Number of arrests attributed to non-forcible sex offenses. Data are from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.
Arrests for Prostitution	Number of arrests attributed to prostitution. Data are from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.
Child Intakes Accepted for Child on Child Sexual Abuse	Number of child intakes related to child on child sexual abuse accepted by Child Welfare Hotline staff and referred for investigation. Data are from the Florida Department of Children and Families.
Children Under 18 in Foster Care	Number of children under age 18 in foster care. Data are from the Florida Department of Children and Families.
Commercial Sex Acts Offenses	Number of offenses attributed to commercial sex acts. Data are from the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
Emergency Medical Service Responses to a Suspected Non-fatal Drug Overdose Including Opioids	Patients with an identified non-fatal drug overdose during an emergency medical service transport, data from Florida's EMSTARS database which includes 90% of Florida's prehospital emergency transports. These data come from the Florida Enhanced State Opioid Overdose Surveillance Program Dashboard County Report. Data are from Florida's EMSTARS database which includes 90% of Florida's prehospital emergency transports. These data come from the Florida Enhanced State Opioid Overdose Surveillance Program Dashboard County Report.
Estimated Seriously Emotionally Disturbed Youth Ages 9-17	This is the estimated number of youth ages 9-17 years old with a serious emotional disturbance with substantial to extreme functional impairment. The estimate is based on a report called Mental Health, United States, 1996 from the Department of Health and Human Services which found that conservatively, 9% of the population ages 9-17 years old is affected. Using the 9% estimate results in rates for all counties being equal. The change in numbers over time is directly reflective of the change in population of that age group rather than a change in the mental health status of the population. Data are from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.
Estimated Seriously Mentally Ill Adults	Serious mental illness among people ages 18 and older is defined as having, at any time during the past year, a diagnosable mental, behavior, or emotional disorder that causes serious functional impairment that substantially interferes with or limits one or more major life activities. Serious mental illnesses include major depression, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and other mental disorders that cause serious impairment. These counts are estimates based on the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) statement that 4.0% of the population 18 and over in 2012 and 2013, 3.6% of the population 18 and over in 2014-2016, and 3.9% of the population 18 and over in 2017-2019 had serious mental illness. We apply the latest estimates to Florida's population and in each county. The change in numbers over time is directly reflective of the change population of that age group rather than a change in the mental health status of the population. Estimates are based on the Department of Health and Human Services report Mental Health, United States, 1996.
Homeless Estimate	The estimated number of people who are homeless. Estimates are derived from a point-in-time count of homeless people. Data are from the Florida Department of Children and Families, Office of Homelessness.

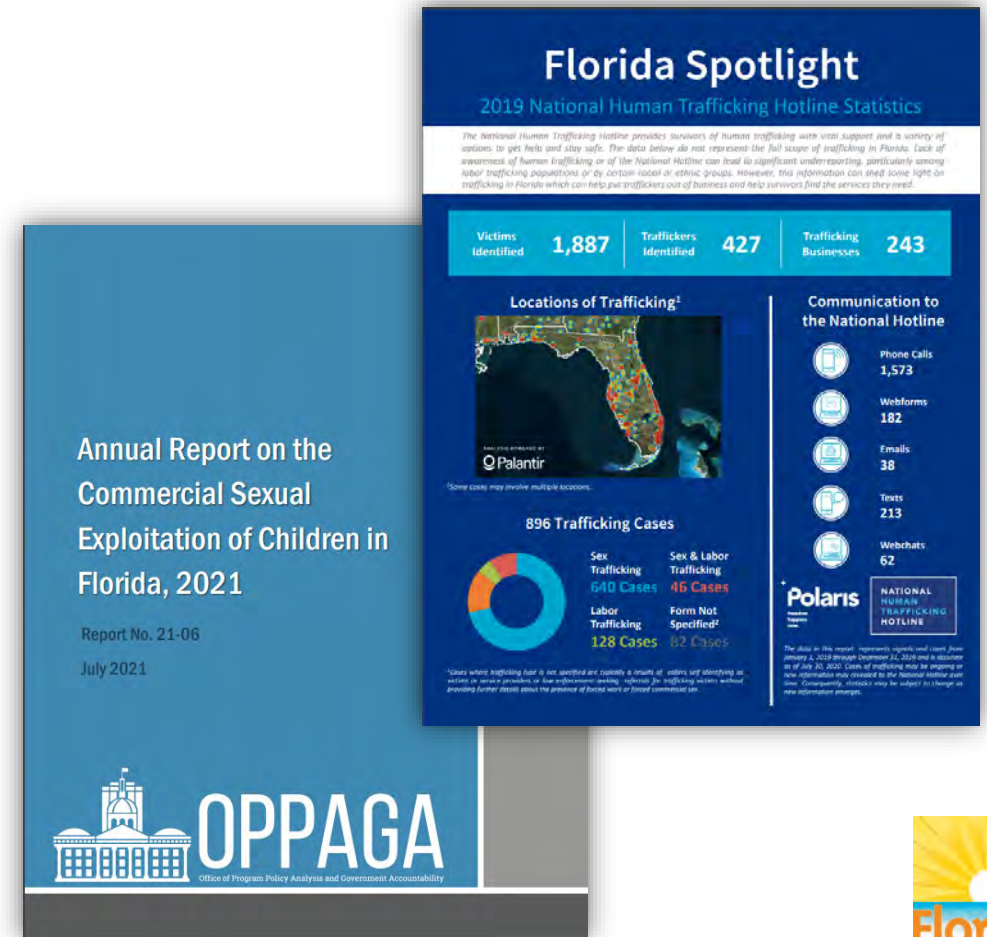
