## Opportunities for Students

The UCF Global Perspectives Office provides students with unique opportunities to become more engaged on campus. Through internships, scholarships and fellowships, students can help advance the goal of sharpening UCF's international focus. Students participate in a variety of research projects on topics including Diplomacy, the Environment and Global Climate Change, Terrorism Studies and Human Rights, among others. Interns, scholars and fellows are exposed to an array of distinguished visitors and viewpoints through their direct involvement with our co-curricular programs.

Some of these opportunities are not exclusive to UCF students. The Global Peace Fellowship and Human Trafficking Awareness Fellowship, the William MacArthur International Affairs Scholarship for college/university students, and all of our internship opportunities are available for outstanding undergraduate (at least junior level) or graduate students from Central Florida colleges or universities. In addition, each year, a William MacArthur International Affairs Scholarship is available to a Central Florida high school junior or senior, as are a limited number of high school internships for Central Florida seniors.

The Global Perspectives Office experience includes helping with the coordination and execution of events, participating in program research and assisting with general office-related activities. Global Perspectives fellows are selected by a board of reviewers drawn from UCF and the community, and can expect to work on a research project with the goal of producing a final, publishable paper. Examples of fellowship research topics are Global Peace and Security Studies, India and Globalization. Recipients of the William MacArthur International Affairs Scholarship are given the responsibility of

## Event Spotlight



### **Arun Gandhi, "Lessons Learned from My Grandfather: Non-Violence in a Violent World"**

Arun Gandhi, a noted peace activist and grandson of Mahatma Gandhi, will speak Thursday, November 10, 2011, at the University of Central Florida. Gandhi will give a presentation entitled "Lessons Learned from My Grandfather: Non-Violence in a

Violent World" at 3 p.m. in the Cape Florida Ballroom of the Student Union.

Gandhi was born and raised in apartheid-era South Africa. At the age of 12, he went to live with his grandfather in India. It was during this time that he observed firsthand the national campaign for liberation through nonviolent means.

Following his visit to India, Gandhi went on to lead successful economic and social reforms in India. He then came to the United States, where he and his late wife Sunanda founded the M.K. Gandhi Institute for Nonviolence. The Institute's goals are to further the study and practice of nonviolence while also providing a unique source of information about Mahatma Gandhi and his work.
