The Isle of Man Recognizes UCF

The newly launched Isle of Man Small Countries Program at UCF received special attention in April during the Florida International Summit on the university's main campus. Tim Cullen, a member of the program's advisory board, who was a featured speaker at the forum, unveiled a special gift to UCF: the Manx flag. The presentation of the flag was accompanied by a letter from the Honorable Allan Bell, MHK, the island's Chief Minister. The Isle of Man, which has the oldest parliament in the world, has been the main sponsor of the Small Countries Financial Management Centre (SCFMC), working closely with the World Bank and the Commonwealth Secretariat.
