

GP Fellow's Winning Research

Lucien Charland, a senior majoring in International and Global Studies and Economics, has been an intern and fellow at the Global Perspectives Office (GP) since his first semester at UCF. In his capacity as the Isle of Man Small Countries Fellow for the fall 2012 term, he wrote his semester research paper, "The Strategic Threat of Sea Level Rise for the United States and its Allies in the Caribbean." Last semester, working with faculty advisor Ted Reynolds, Charland presented the paper on a panel at the Florida Political Science Association's annual conference in Miami, and later as a poster presentation for UCF's Undergraduate Research Showcase. There, he won first prize for the Social Science I division and was awarded a \$600 scholarship.

Says Reynolds, "Lucien's success is a reflection of the value of his research and his dedication to excellence in his academic endeavors, inside and outside of Global Perspectives."



GP prides itself on creating an environment that encourages students to go further with their research. In the past, students have worked on subjects that relate to their undergraduate or graduate theses, submitted articles to local newspapers and

Student Positions Available at GP

If you are interested in global issues and want to gain course credit and experience, then you might consider applying for an internship or fellowship at GP. The office is offering six paid fellowship positions and several internship positions for the fall semester. Students from any major can apply; some fellowships even accept applications from other educational institutions.

“It’s a great research experience and presents multiple opportunities to build relationships and forge connections,” said summer intern Brandon Kelley, a graduate student in Political Science.

In addition to research and office assistance, interns and fellows help to facilitate the multiple public events that GP organizes each semester. Every fellowship program awards \$500 for the semester with the exception of the Lawrence J. Chastang Global Fellowship, which provides \$1,000. GP is also offering the MacArthur Scholarship that awards \$500 to a student, but does not have an internship component.

Internships require an applicant to have a minimum 3.0 GPA, to be at least a Junior and to submit an application and resume by July 26, 2013. Applicants for fellowships must also be a Junior or higher and submit a resume and application, but

must also have a minimum 3.5 GPA, two letters of reference, a one-page personal statement, a 5-10 page writing sample and an unofficial transcript. Interns and fellows are expected to have a weekly time commitment of approximately 12 to 15 hours, with 10 hours dedicated to time in the office.
