
The series this year features the following speakers and subjects:

Human Trafficking Awareness Forum

This event features expert and first-hand perspectives on human trafficking. Students, faculty, staff and community members are invited to hear from a survivor of sex trafficking, an expert who helps survivors recover and a scholar who studies social media practices used by traffickers.

The forum is a feature of UCF's first-ever <u>Sex Positive Week</u>, which seeks to foster an open community dialogue increasing self-awareness, providing education and increasing sexual health. The event takes place from 3:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., on Thursday, February 18, 2016, in the Garden Key of the UCF Student Union. Florida International Summit

The University of Central Florida will host the 2016 Florida International Summit on Thursday, February 25, 2016 in the Pegasus Ballroom of the UCF Student Union, from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The summit is the signature event that the Florida Network for Global Studies (FNGS) supports every year. The network is a coalition that, through established global studies programs, aims to advance the exchange of information on economic, political, social and technological change taking place in an increasingly globalized

world. Each year, the location of the summit rotates among member schools - FIU, FSU, UCF, UF, UNF and USF.



The theme of this year's summit is "Transforming the World Through Education." Distinguished presenters in keynote addresses and panel discussions will address key issues in global education from the perspectives of government, NGOs, academia and journalism. Keynote presenters include President and CEO of the Institute of International Education Allan Goodman, and Belize's Minister of Education, Youth, Sports and Culture, the Hon. Patrick J. Faber. The first panel will discuss the importance of international literacy, while the second will explore the process of shaping a global citizen. The third panel will feature several Pulitzer Prize winners and finalists, discussing the role of the news media in international education and awareness.

This event is one of UCF's contributions to the Pulitzer Centennial Campfires Initiative in 2016. Breakfast and lunch are provided.
