The purpose of this fellowship is to recognize and honor the work of South African anti-apartheid leader and former president, Nelson Mandela, who once stated, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."

Call for Applications

If you are interested in global issues and want to gain course credit and experience, then consider applying for an internship at GP. The office is offering eight paid fellowships as well as several internships for the fall semester. These opportunities are available to students of any major, with many available to non-UCF students. In addition to research and office assistance, GP interns and fellows help facilitate the multiple public events that GP hosts throughout the semester. Most students are eligible to pursue course credit for their time and effort, if they seek it.

Internship applicants are required to have a minimum 3.0 GPA, to be at least a Junior by credit, and to submit an application, cover letter, and resume by August 4, 2017. Applicants for fellowships must also be a Junior or higher with a minimum 3.5 GPA, and must submit a one-page personal statement, a 5-10 page writing sample, a resume with two listed references, and an unofficial transcript. All student positions require a weekly time commitment of approximately 10 to 15 hours. To apply, or for more information, students may click [here](#).
