Insights on Taiwan's New President

GP staff and students recently participated in a roundtable teleconference about next steps for Taiwan and its new president, Tsai Ing-Wen. The event was hosted by The Heritage Foundation (THF) and the Washington Roundtable for the Asia-Pacific Press, and featured discussions led by THF Asian Studies Center Director Walter Lohman. Lohman touched on Taiwan's changing economic, social and political landscape, and what it might mean for future relations with China and other countries, like the U.S. This timely teleconference was hosted the day before Ing-Wen's inauguration, and provided critical insight into the potential for cross-strait relations.

Atlanta Attorney David W. Boone received the award on May 11, 2016, which recognized “lawyers and judges who have shown outstanding merit and who excel in providing access to justice for all.” The award described Boone as “an avid protector of our justice system.”
