of panel presentations on critical topics such as the Middle East, immigration and refugees, and climate change.

“The experience helped expand UCF’s connections with the Council and other institutions, as well as its access to prominent experts for insights on global issues and potential campus visits,” Bersia said. Participants also discussed classroom teaching approaches, including model diplomacy (role-playing in realistic settings). Bersia added that because the Council is eager to share its growing resources in this area, UCF professors – including those who already use simulations – stand to benefit.
